


Chords To INSTANTLY Change The Way You Play Eddie Haddad


In this reference material I'm showing you fretboard diagrams of the chord parallel shapes used in the lesson.


NOTE: fretboard diagrams are to be read in a top-down video of your guitar. The low E string is on the bottom of the diagram and the high E is on top. The numbers on the dots represent which of your fretting fingers to use to play the chord shapes.

- 1 index finger
- 2 middle finger
- 3 ring finger
- 4 pinky finger


Below are the chord shapes in their "default" position. Later on we'll be moving them up the neck.








D minor Chord Shape
